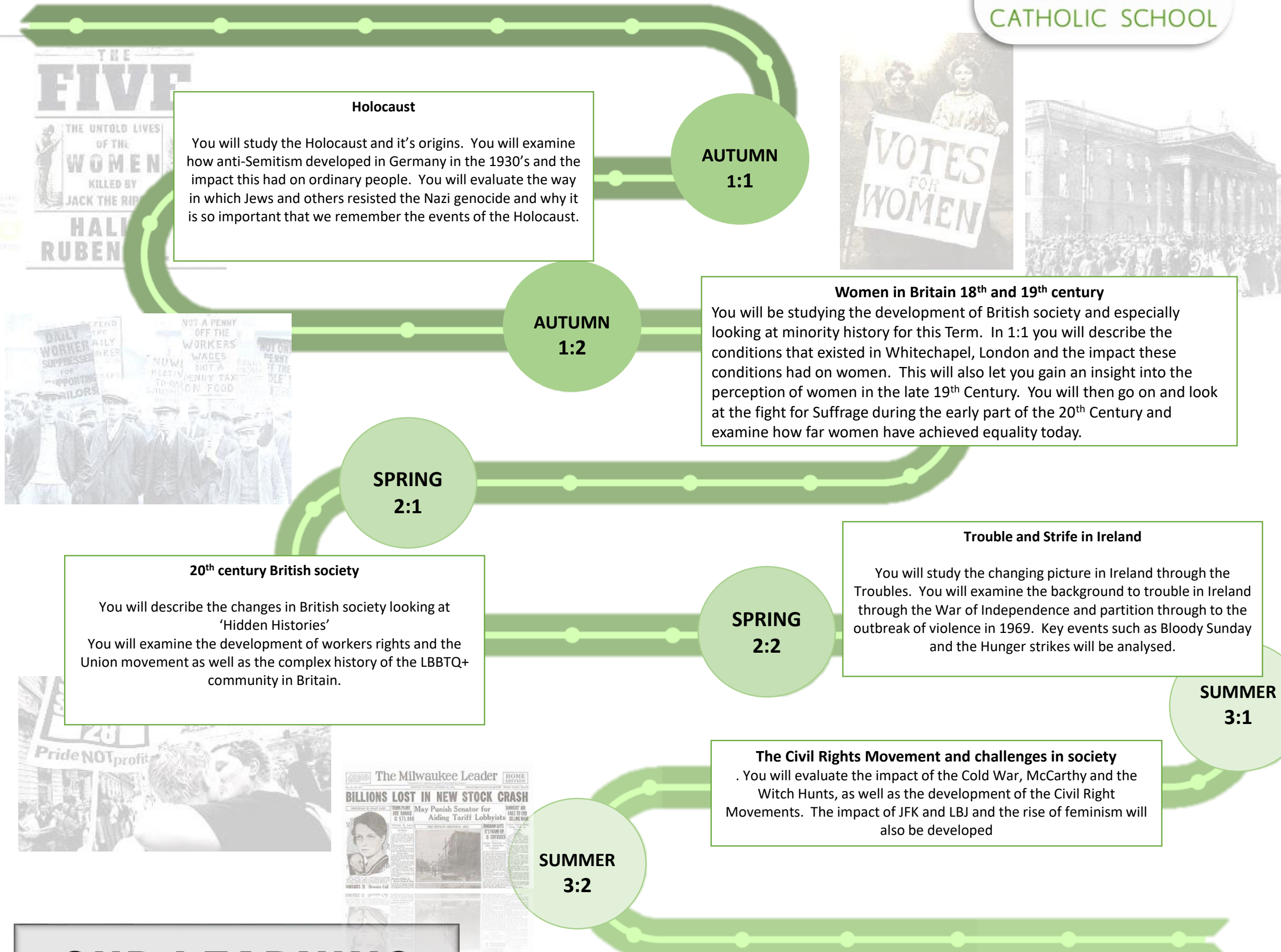


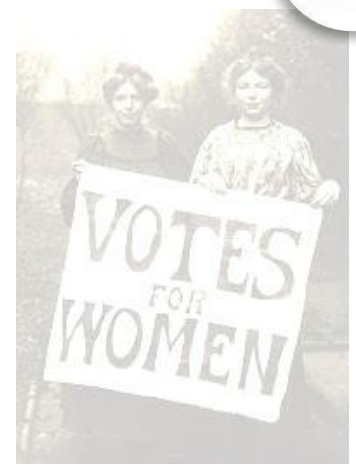
# HISTORY KS3: Year 9



**Holocaust**

You will study the Holocaust and its origins. You will examine how anti-Semitism developed in Germany in the 1930's and the impact this had on ordinary people. You will evaluate the way in which Jews and others resisted the Nazi genocide and why it is so important that we remember the events of the Holocaust.

**Women in Britain 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century**

You will be studying the development of British society and especially looking at minority history for this Term. In 1:1 you will describe the conditions that existed in Whitechapel, London and the impact these conditions had on women. This will also let you gain an insight into the perception of women in the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century. You will then go on and look at the fight for Suffrage during the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century and examine how far women have achieved equality today.

**20<sup>th</sup> century British society**

You will describe the changes in British society looking at 'Hidden Histories'

You will examine the development of workers rights and the Union movement as well as the complex history of the LBBTQ+ community in Britain.

**SPRING 2:2**

**Trouble and Strife in Ireland**

You will study the changing picture in Ireland through the Troubles. You will examine the background to trouble in Ireland through the War of Independence and partition through to the outbreak of violence in 1969. Key events such as Bloody Sunday and the Hunger strikes will be analysed.
